# MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT JIM JONES

### "THE NEW NORMAL"


Most of us have experienced some significant events in our lives that changed the way we did things and created a "new normal". I remember the Tylenol scare of the 1970's that changed products on the shelves and introduced "tamper evident" packaging to our society. Certainly, the events of September 11<sup>th</sup> changed the face of air travel forever.

With remarkable speed all of us have adapted to "social distancing", increased hand washing and sanitizing, wearing of face masks as well as frequently taking temperatures and monitoring symptoms of COVID-19. As with the events I mentioned above this literally happened almost overnight, and none of us would have ever expected that we would all be at home or that businesses, churches and schools would be closed for weeks on end.

And while all of us are eager to return to "normal", none of us really knows what the "new normal" will look like and there is even a possibility that we won't be able to return to the way things used to be. - BE CREATIVE, RESILIENT, FLEXIBLE AND READY TO PIVOT

In the coming weeks and months, The Greater Mulberry Chamber of Commerce will be here to support and assist our members and our community. Whatever our "new normal" looks like, I find comfort that we will experience it together.



As flights were canceled into the country the supply chain was interrupted and Pat found it difficult to get his daily shipment of flowers from South America. Imagine that....a florist with no flowers! When he did find supplies, the costs were 2-3 times more expensive than prices before the pandemic. And on top of that, weddings, funerals and events were canceled or postponed. So some days he didn't even need flowers!

The daily change of the narrative and constant change of information caused Pat and his staff to look for new norms and to get creative. BUT ONE THING HE SAYS HAS HELPED THEM WEATHER THE STORM...TAKE IT ONE DAY AT A TIME. Then establish new goals. Change your goals when needed. And look for and embrace the new norms. As a result of this attitude, sales begin to rise ...20% on Easter 40% on Mothers Day. Pat says they had to do some things they had never done before....but you have to focus on the future to build upon your past. He said he would have never imagined when he bought a florist years ago that someday he would come up with the idea of "contactless delivery"! But the willingness to change and the desires of the customer may have created a new norm in his business.



Sandi Simpson


With cancelled and rescheduled events, many of you have not had a chance to meet our interim Executive Director, Sandi Simpson. When you do meet her, you will be in for real treat.



# *Meanwhile* at City Hall ...

The City of Mulberry is slowly beginning to re-open our various buildings to the general public. We will begin by opening the Mulberry Public Library on Tuesday, May 26th, followed by the Mulberry Cultural Center and Mulberry Phosphate Museum on Wednesday May 27th. Mulberry City Hall will remain closed to the public at this time. Please see below for all the details on our Phase 1 openings.

Beginning Tuesday, May 26th the Mulberry Public Library will re-open to 50% capacity. There will be no lingering, or computer usage allowed, and all in-person programing is suspended for the time being. Please utilize the Mulberry Public Library's YouTube and Facebook for their extended virtual programming catalog. They will continue their door-side service, and faxing, printing and coping will be available only for government, medical and job search needs. These services will be complimentary through the end of May.

On Wednesday, May 27th, the Mulberry Cultural Center and Mulberry Phosphate Museum will re-open to 50% capacity, and suspending all in-person programming. Please check out the Mulberry Cultural Center and Mulberry Phosphate Museum on their Facebook and YouTube pages for quality virtual programming and content.

When all three facilities re-open we ask that all visitors practice social distancing and recommend that masks be worn.

City Hall is remaining closed at this time, but accepting payments online and check or money orders in the drop box at the City Hall parking lot. We are suspending all late fees, disconnection fees, and point and pay fees for the time being. There will be no water cut-offs through mid-June.

All rental facilities are closed through the month of June. Parks and Playgrounds (sanitization happening twice daily) are open and we ask all visitors to practice social distancing.
